NEW PASTOR APPOINTED

New Pastor Appointed for Calvary United Methodist Church

Dear Church Family,

July 1, 2022 will be a time of transition for Calvary United Methodist Church. Reverend Larry Homitsky will begin his retirement from the ministry and Reverend Kelly Smith will assume the lead pastor role at the Monroeville United Methodist Church.

To prepare for the future of Calvary, the Staff Parish Relations Committee, the Chair of Church Council and our Lay Leader have been meeting with the District Superintendent. A full-time pastor was requested. Through prayer and discernment, the District Superintendent, Cabinet and Bishop made a pastoral appointment for Calvary and on Friday, March 18, 2022, the District Superintendent introduced the newly appointed pastor to the Staff Parish Relations Committee, the Chair of Church Council and our Lay Leader. Our new pastor is Rev. Shane Siciliano. The announcement was made to the congregation on Sunday, March 20th. **Shane will join Calvary on July 1, 2022.** To get to know our new pastor, a bio is provided below.

Shane was born and raised in Southwest Florida, but he has lived in Western Pennsylvania for most of his life. Shane attained his bachelor's degree and Master of Social Work at the University of Pittsburgh, specializing in community organizing and social administration, before graduating from Pittsburgh Theological Seminary.

Shane worked to collaborate with others in Downtown Pittsburgh when the only homeless shelter for youth closed. He helped establish a new base of operations at the Gay & Lesbian Community Center to provide these youth with housing, employment, and educational services. As a social worker, Shane worked in McKeesport running HIV/AIDS projects.

Shane has served as pastor of Point UMC and Alum Bank UMC. He is the current vice chair of the Commission on Archives and History. Shane promotes the sacraments and Kingdom-building and works hard to foster the full inclusion of all people in the church. His three biggest passions for outreach ministry currently are serving as a camp counselor, helping at-risk families, and organizing collaborations.

Shane visits his family in Central PA. He enjoys Marvel movies, tabletop games, and exercise competitions with his best friend. Shane's friends are his family, too, sharing visits and vacations. Shane has traveled to many states and countries including mission trips to Mississippi, South Africa, and Lesotho. He believes that we are all meant to be part of a team, joining to build up God's Kingdom here on earth.

WHAT IS AHPS? ...A LITTLE CALVARY HISTORY LESSON

What is AHPS? ...A LITTLE CALVARY HISTORY LESSON

Over three decades ago, neighbors, particularly Jack Schmidt along with other concerned Pittsburghers, who worried that that lovely historic church in their North Side neighborhood would close or be lost through neglect or other peril, decided to form a new “non-profit” with the goal of “Saving Calvary Church!” They knew the building was in deep trouble, and the priceless Tiffany windows were especially in jeopardy! The United Methodist Denomination didn’t have the resources that could repair the building, and the congregation was struggling and didn’t even have the resources to stay open! So, these “Saints” (who were from all various denominations and traditions), formed “The Allegheny Historic Preservation Society” and got to work! Their plan was to find volunteers to help clean up the property and at the same time, go after local sources of funding to secure grants and foundation support to repair the building!

The first grants allowed the church to repair the leaking roof! A great deal of damage was occurring because replacing a slate roof was unbelievably expensive and cheaper substitutes were unacceptable for a historic structure! Then, repointing the stones, fixing the iron railings and broken walkways took place. There were plumbing problems, heating problems and broken and sagging glass everywhere. It looked impossible!

Calvary was then, a two point charge! One minister served both Calvary and the Buena Vista UMC a short distance away. But then, that minister decided that Calvary’s future was hopeless and chose to focus his time at Buena Vista, (which later closed and has become the home of “The Fabled Table!”) Calvary would have closed as well, but the Pittsburgh District Superintendent, the Rev. Madge Floyd, approached the Rev. Bob Richards (who was President of the United Methodist Church Union, the city’s mission agency whose offices were in Calvary!) to ask him to please become Calvary’s pastor.! Rev. Bob didn’t want to have to move the Church Union’s offices, and didn’t believe city churches had to close, so he agreed to add Calvary UMC’s pastorate to his list of over nine major mission projects! These included institutional ministries such as Goodwill Industries, Zoar Home, Ward Home, three Senior Citizen residential homes, and low-income apartment buildings in the city, plus a number of other responsibilities having to do with other missions of the Conference. He didn’t hesitate! He became Calvary’s first and only “Volunteer Pastor” and Lydia Hughes, his secretary, agreed to these extra duties also. Minna Bullard was the part time organist, and Aleata Weiss worked in the church’s community child care nursery school.

At this time, in 1989, Calvary’s worship services were in the chapel. The congregation had closed off the sanctuary as there was no money to heat it, and for most Sundays, only about 12 to 20 persons were in attendance anyway. The chapel seemed friendlier as well as warmer! There was no “choir” and no children, so no Sunday School either! Somehow, even with seemingly insurmountable challenges, the Calvary “remnant congregation” managed to put on a weekly Thursday luncheon and find a local professor, Dr. David Harris to lead worship.

David stayed to help Bob, and soon the church was paying each of them \$100 a month “for expenses!” (David was wheel-chair bound because of surgery to remove cancer from his spine, and could only get into the building because of the ramp. But, his service was before the elevator and the bathroom on the first floor were built and was difficult for him!)

The workers were few, but their devotion was exceptional! Trudy Harris, David’s wife, a nurse at the VA, took a part-time schedule so she could manage the luncheons. Linda Erlich’s mother, Florence, was a faithful participant and “waitress!” Aleata stayed regularly after the child care program was over to clean the church (and decorated for all the holidays!) While there was a pipe organ in the chapel, it was never played. It couldn’t be played! There were no pipes in it! Apparently, when the bills for work on the Sanctuary organ could not be paid, the organ repair

company was paid in pipes! Bob's wife, Nancy baked two pies every week, and also got her friend, a custom beveler, to make several clear quatrefoils for the missing places in the entry door in the sanctuary and to replace the larger and very thick beveled glass on the Beech Ave door which was badly cracked after a robbery attempt. She also got her friend, Nick Parendo from Hunt Stained Glass Co. to repair the broken panel in the balcony window (there was missing glass around the angel's foot) and the hopper window under Christ's Resurrection window. He never sent a bill!!! Faithful members like Charles Moore, and Jorinda Saunders Bullitt. and Doug Lucas, Holly Police and Martha Helmrich in addition to the others already mentioned (and others who have passed away) were the very personification of support with their "prayers, their presence, their gifts and their service!"

This was Calvary's situation when AHPS was formed. Dr. Sam Gibson was the liaison between the congregation and the AHPS board. Margee Bilyak was one of the earliest members and worked closely with Rev. Bob Richards for over 30 years, and is now President of the organization which today is fully volunteer. Susan Brandt, Dennis Panek and Sandra Pack were hired "Directors" of AHPS when millions of grant money was secured and actual renovation was being done on the building and active oversight was required. But as work was begun and completed, fewer applications needed to be submitted for necessary repairs and restoration. The congregation was growing as well, under the leadership of The Rev. Patricia Molllock, the Rev. Wesley Blaha, the Rev. Tom Funk and lastly, the Rev. Larry Homitsky and most recently with the Rev. Kelly Smith.

The Pandemic certainly curtailed both the Tiffany Concerts and eliminated many well-loved programs by AHPS and the Calvary congregation. The untimely death of the Rev. Bob Richards who was Chair of the Restoration Committee and expected to be Vice Chair after the retirement of Sandra, left AHPS needing to refigure its mission if it was going to survive to continue the work it began. Currently, AHPS has recommitted to continuing as an all volunteer civic-minded group. It is assisting the Elks and AHPS's treasurer, Tim Zinn, with making applications and grants for their renovations, and continues to serve Calvary with Jesse Belfast, (nominated as a Trustee because of his expertise), and Margee Bilyak and David Grinnell and Mary Callison, as active and devoted members of Calvary, and Nancy Richards whose "angel cards" are raising much needed funds and support for the pew restoration and cushion replacement project, Kirk Weaver, who managed the restoration of our Tiffany windows and knows how unique this civic and church partnership is, has joined the AHPS Board to continue his professional support of Calvary and other historical buildings on the North Side!

Now, AHPS is asking for your support! When we approach the Foundations of Pittsburgh, and apply for funding, we need to show that we have the wider interest and support of the community. We need more members! For \$10.00 per year (or \$8.00 for Seniors) you can join us! There will be concerts you can attend, or you may wish to volunteer to usher or help us sell cards, or you can do nothing! (Your membership donation is help enough!) On October 15th, we'll be showcasing our stained glass windows along with other locations in Pittsburgh who have significant stained glass to share, and on June 21st, for the Summer Solstice, we're inviting the community to stop by from 3-7 PM, to see the sun streaming through the "St. John on the Island of Patmos balcony window!" (For FREE!!!)

Please become a member of AHPS in recognition and gratitude for the over \$3,500,000 raised over the past three decades to save our Church! We need to show the Foundations and Grant Writers that we have our community's support and involvement! HAVE SOMETHING TO SHARE?
